

Town Board Meeting

May 16, 2022

Highway: Highway Superintendent Dobrovosky reported the Highway Department had repaired road signs, did some street sweeping, ditching and service and maintenance to equipment.

The Board asked if there was any clean up after the recent storm. He stated yes, they had cleaned up a few downed trees.

Transfer Station: Municipal Recycling Liaison/Refuse Officer Brian Buff reported since the last meeting they had sent out seven trash dumpsters, nine open top containers and three recycling dumpsters. He reviewed the trash and recycling report he submitted to the Board. They had a savings of over \$34,000 so far for 2022 with the changes made at the Transfer Station.

Mr. Buff stated the staff would be getting training on the paint removal which would be starting in the next few weeks. The cans must have a label be closed for the Transfer Station to accept.

Parks: Gene LaForte reported for the Parks Department. He reported they continue to interview for Playday councilors and lifeguards. They are working on the design for the new Pickleball courts. They had cleaned up downed trees on the Charlie Major Nature Trail, weed eating and mowing at all the parks. The Farmers Market start date is May 26th.

Mr. LaForte reported that the stone bridges at the entrance to Austin Park are in need of repair, due to the increase in traffic entering the Park. They had received three quotes as required by the Town of Skaneateles procurement Policy:

Mend – All Masonry	\$6,000.00
Lake Country Construction	\$4,925.00
Spearing’s Masonry	\$4,637.72

Mr. LaForte stated the current bridge is made of large stone. The rebuild of the bridge would be concrete with a stone look on the side facing the drive with a cap along the top. These bridges had been repaired in the past and need to be rebuilt.

Councilor Alexander stated the previous Highway Superintendent, Allan Wellington looked at the bridge last year and reported the structure of the bridge is fine. The stone had just broken away.

Supervisor Aaron asked if they would recommend the low bid from Spearing Masonry? Mr. Laforte stated Spearing Masonry is the company they are recommending, and the money is in the 2022 budget.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Tucker and with unanimous (5-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board approved the bid from Spearing Masonry for \$4,637.72 to repair the bridge at the entrance to Austin Park contingent on receiving the necessary insurance and contract.

Dog Control Officer: Supervisor Aaron reported they are in receipt of Dog Control Officer, David Wawro's April. * See attached report

Fire Department: Fire Chief Peter Buehler reviewed the April Skaneateles Fire Department Report. * See attached report

Minutes of May 2, 2022: On a motion of Councilor Tucker, seconded by Councilor Alexander, and with a (4-0) affirmation, of the Town Board, minutes of May 2, 2022 were accept as presented, Supervisor Aaron abstained due to absence at the May 2, 2022, Town Board meeting.

Data Collection Update – GAR Associates LLC: Supervisor Aaron announced the Town had contracted with GAR Associates, LLC for a town wide data collection in preparation for a town wide reval. GAR Associates would be starting to drive around the Town, view each parcel, and take pictures. She introduced Dave Barnett and Cindy Blair of GAR Associates.

Mr. Barnett gave a summary of their progress with the data collection. They started in late winter of this year when property record cards were pulled and reviewed. In March 2022 they met with the Mike Maxwell, Town Assessor to establish procedures for the collection. The data collection process is dictated by the Real Property Tax Law and the Data Collection Manual. Each property is looked at for size, square footage, material, and amenities. At this point they are approximately 50% complete with the data information. The property record cards had been returned to the Town and they had established access to the RPS System, Real Property State Data Base system. They would be starting to enter information into the system by next week and they would begin driving around and taking pictures of each parcel for the files. The GAR employees would be identified with ID badges and magnetic signs on their vehicles. There will be a post card sent to all residents with information regarding the data collection and that photos that would be taken. This will let property owners know what to expect.

Supervisor Aaron asked if there would be a contact number on the post card. Mr. Barnett stated yes, there is a toll-free number for anyone to call with questions.

Councilor Alexander asked if these post cards would be mailed to all residents. Mr. Barnett stated yes, all residents.

Councilor Dove asked if the post cards had been sent yet. Mr. Barnett stated not yet, they were waiting for final approval. Councilor Dove said the post cards should go our before they start their field work.

Mr. Barnett stated the press release went out this week. He would make sure the post cards go out this week as well.

Councilor Legg asked if they would be taking any photos from the lake side or ariel of the parcels? Mr. Barnet stated they are utilizing overhead imagery that was taken March of 2021.

Councilor Alexander asked if this was their imagery, or do they use Google or something similar? Mr. Barnet stated they subscribe to a service that is more advanced than Google. A company called Eagle View. Councilor Alexander asked what percentage of the imagery would be used from the third-party company? Mr. Barnett stated he is not sure until they start the photo process. The majority should be on site street level photographs.

Supervisor Aaron asked if they were on schedule. Mr. Barnett stated yes. They had some staffing issues with COVID, but they are back now. Supervisor Aaron asked if they are still anticipating being completed by August? Mr. Barnet stated yes, that is a realistic goal.

Ms. Blair stated they are confident they would finish the data collection portion by August 31st, but the pictures might spill over to the Fall in order to get the best picture equality. The photos are being billed separately and the Town would not be billed until the photos are completed.

Supervisor Aaron and the Board thanked Dave Barnet and Cindy Blair of GAR Associates for the update.

License Agreement Transportation Drive – Woodbine Group: Attorney Smith reviewed the License he had drawn up for the agreement between the Town of Skaneateles and the Woodbine Group regarding Transportation Drive.

Attorney Smith stated the term of the contract would be for 10 years and there would be no fee. He laid out the uses on Transportation Drive in the agreement:

“ Licensee agrees that the Premises shall be used only for the construction and maintenance of certain improvements set forth in Schedule A; namely, landscaping, fire hydrant(s), crosswalk(s), curbing and other improvements. Licensee shall be solely responsible for the construction and maintenance of the improvements. This agreement grants the Licensee permission to construct and maintain the improvements but does not grant any other rights to the Premises.”

Attorney stated the uses would be controlled by the drawing which is exhibit “A” in the License Agreement. This can be changed by the Board in the future with this license agreement. The Board had discussed the Planning and Zoning Board’s requirement of a crosswalk. If the Planning Board or Zoning Board had to change their conditions, it would pause the project. If the Town Board denied any of the conditions the applicant would have to go back to the Planning or Zoning Boards to amend the original approval.

Supervisor Aaron stated she had reviewed the application and the minutes of the Planning Board. The Planning Board did a very thorough job of reviewing this and considered all

factors including safety. She stated she is comfortable with the recommendations and requirements of the Planning Board and Zoning Board including the crosswalk.

Councilor Dove asked if the crosswalk is going to a sidewalk or another driveway. Attorney Smith stated the parts that are in the Town's right-of-way or on the map are provided in exhibit A. The crosswalk in the Town's right-of-way as shown on the drawing which goes to the gas station.

Councilor Legg stated this goes to the grassy patch next to the guardrail along Transportation Drive.

Councilor Dove asked if the NYS Department of Transportation allows a crosswalk where this is no sidewalk? Attorney Smith stated yes, legally you can, there is no law.

Councilor Legg stated in the safety review by C&S Engineering they confirmed this was an appropriate crosswalk.

Attorney Smith stated the Board has three options:

1. The Board could approve the request as they have asked for.
2. The Board could back to the Planning and Zoning Boards and ask them to change their conditions.
3. The Board could do nothing, do not grant the license.

Attorney Smith explained to the Board, at this point they could not dictate new conditions. The applicant has approval from Planning and Zoning with these conditions. If the Town Board requested new conditions, it would have to be sent back to the Planning and Zoning Boards.

Councilor Tucker stated since this is a Special Permit it could be reviewed later on. Councilor Dove asked since the licenses term is 10 years would the Board have to wait the 10 years to review it again. Attorney Smith stated no this is the term to allow the applicant to use the Town's right-of-way. This license could be terminated with 30 days' notice.

Councilor Dove asked where the stop signs would be placed. The Board reviewed the site plan and the locations of the stop signs. There are two stop signs proposed on the map. They discussed encouraging the Quick fill to install stop signs at their entrance on to Transportation Drive.

Attorney Smith reviewed the agreement. *Copy of License Agreement attached

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Legg and with unanimous (5-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board authorized Supervisor Aaron to sign the License Agreement with 813 West Genesee Street, LLC.

Note: Councilor Dove stated for the record she was voting Aye but believed the crosswalk was overkill for this project. And would like the Board to review this plan again in the future.

Councilor Alexander stated she agreed with rereviewing the agreement in the future.

Community Garden License Agreement: Councilor Alexander stated since the Community Garden is underway, she wanted Attorney Smith to advise on a License Agreement or waiver for those who would be working at the garden at the Town of Skaneateles Conservation Area.

Attorney Smith reviewed the License Agreement he had prepared for the Board. Councilor Alexander stated the volunteers could sign a waiver which would indemnify the Town of Skaneateles. Attorney Smith stated the individuals on the committee would be listed on the License Agreement and volunteers would sign the waiver. This is a standard agreement. This license would not require the group to provide an insurance certificate. Councilor Alexander stated the indemnity should be taken off the group and the waiver should be for all committee members and volunteers.

Chris Buff, Community Garden Committee member stated they have no problem with the agreement. She thanked the Board for their support.

On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Legg and with unanimous (5-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board authorized Supervisor Aaron to sign the License Agreement with the Community Garden Committee subject to receiving the map of the proposed garden location.

Northern Hamlet Master Plan – Public Workshop June 8th 5:30 p.m. -7:30 p.m.: Councilor Legg reported the Hamlet Committee had been preparing with EDR to begin the Public Workshops for the Northern Hamlet Plan. This would encompass Mottville and Skaneateles Falls. The first of two public workshops is scheduled for June 8th at the Mottville Fire Hall from 5:30 p.m. -7:30 p.m. The second workshop is planned for later in the summer in Skaneateles Falls. This is an opportunity for anyone to attend. EDR will be onsite with maps and committee members will be present to listen to the community members. Councilor Legg stated this is not a zoning map exercise.

Reschedule June 20, 2022, and July 4, 2022, Town Board Meeting to June 27, 2022: On a motion of Councilor Alexander, seconded by Councilor Dove and with unanimous (5-0) affirmation of the Town Board, the Board authorized to reschedule The Town Board meeting of June 20th and July 4th to June 27th at 6:30 p.m.

Announcements/Correspondence/Updates

▪ *Parks/Austin Pavilion Project Update:* Supervisor Aaron announced they had met with members of the Village Board, Village Planning and Zoning Boards to discuss the proposed project at Austin Park and Austin Pavilion. The meeting went very well, and the Village was very positive about the proposed project. The Board will be scheduling another informational meeting and a meeting with the neighbors before they begin the design stage.

- *Letter from Chris Buff:* Supervisor Aaron announced a letter was received from Chris Buff regarding The Sinclair. The Board agreed to pass this on to the Town Codes Office for any violations to be investigated.
- *Grievance Day May 24, 2022, 4:00 p.m. -8:00 p.m. :* Supervisor Aaron announced Grievance Day is May 24th 4:00p.m. -8:00p.m. and appointments are encouraged
- *Town Department Hours May - July :* Town Hall Summer Hours July 1, 2022 – September 2, 2022, Closed Fridays at 1:00 p.m., Memorial Day: Town Hall closed Monday May 30, 2022, Transfer Station regular hours Saturday closed Sunday May 29th and Monday 30th
Memorial Day Parade May 30th : Councilor Dove announced the Memorial Day Parade is on May 30th and would begin at 9:00 a.m. at the American Legion on Jordan Street. Councilor Legg announced the the ceremony at Mottville would start at 9:00 a.m. and Sheard Settlement following.

Supervisor Aaron recognized Town Historian Beth Battle re re recognition as Citizen of the Year by the Skaneateles Chamber of Commerce. It was a nice event recognizing Beth and George Battle and Meg O’Connell as Skaneateles Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year.





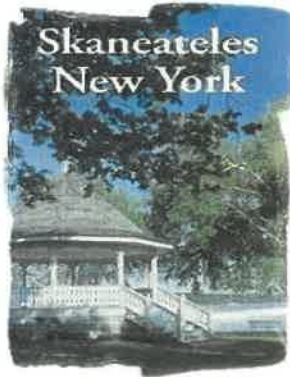

Activity Report

April - 2022

- 1) 04/02/2022 – Jean Alexander – 19 S.Marvin St Auburn – 315-730-3114 – Found an injured cat in her back yard. I explained I do not handle calls in the City of Auburn and inquired how she found my number to call the Skaneateles Animal Control Officer? Jean stated that she contacted Urgent Veterinary Care at 207 West Genesee Street in Auburn and they gave her my name and number – I informed her that Carl Collier was in fact the Animal Control Officer in Auburn – She said she tried calling him first, but he never answered or returned her call. Jean subsequently transported the injured cat to the Urgent Vet Care, where the cat had to be euthanized due to its injuries – (the cats owner was never located)
- 2) 04/02/2022 - Contacted Urgent Veterinary Care – 315-515-3074 – Spoke to Receptionist Nicole and asked why she referred an Auburn resident to the Town of Skaneateles Animal Control Officer? She said that was the only number she had to call. I explained that Carl Collier was responsible to the Auburn area and supplied her with his contact information
- 3) 04/02/2022 – Kelly Dove – 315-406-2362 – Caller reporting a Black Lab male running in/out of Genesee St by the Gazebo – No answer on call back
- 4) 04/05/2022 – Jane Dibble – 3 Hawthorne Woods – 646-737-4158 – Called reporting an infestation of snakes in her back yard. I explained that I only handle dogs and cat complaints. I referred her to Finger Lakes Wildlife.
- 5) 04/07/2022 – Abby Paine – New Seneca Tpk – 315-420-3056 – Called reporting a loose Golden Retriever just outside the village – owner located

- 6) 04/08/2022 – Rene Maravi – Pork St – 315-685-6448 – Complaint of Steve Purcell’s dog from 1809 Pork Street off leash running in and about her yard, eating the chow she leaves out for the barn cats. Maravi inquired if there was a leash law in town? I advised on the specifics and also explained that she may sign a violation of Town ordinance against the actions of the Purcell dog. She declined to at this time.
- 7) 04/09/2022 – Natalie Burrious – 3698 Fisher Rd – 315-430-5255 - Had her 2 American Akita dogs run off – Located
- 8) 04/12/2022 – Checked Austin Park and the Charlie Major Nature Trail for leash law violations – Very little activity – No violations observed
- 9) 04/13/2022 – Ron Chapman – 887 Mottville Rd – 315-685-3506 – Complaint of dogs off leash on the Charlie Major Nature Trail – I advised now that spring is here, I will periodically be walking the Nature trail looking for leash law violations and unlicensed dogs and will be subsequently issuing tickets.
